Nyūjō, etc.

1. Prior to their designated shiai, the competitors shall stand by in the waiting area outside of the shiai-jyō in keitō shisei. They shall perform a mutual bow, i.e., sōgo no rei, in advance, and then in accordance with each call, they shall advance to the waiting-line, i.e., taiki-sen, outside of the shiai-jyo, enter the shiai-jyō, and then take their positions at the starting line, i.e., kaishi-sen.

The kaishi-sen is a red or white line 30 centimeters in length. It is the location where a competior awaits the Shushin's call to start, stop, gōgi, enbu is finished, and Hantei.²⁰²³

Competitors shall stand (approximately 30 centimeters) behind the starting line, i.e., kaishi-sen.²⁰²³

2. <u>If a competitor is unable to participate at</u> the start of their shiai, it will be considered a forfeit.²⁰²³

Nyūjō, etc.

1. When the shinpan-in enter, they shall line up holding their Shinpan flags in their right hand with the Shushin in the center. After the mutual bow, i.e., sōgo no rei, by the shinpan-in, they shall bow to the front, i.e., shōmen no rei, and enter. 2023

2. <u>In the case of a change, the new shinpan</u> <u>shall enter after the Shushin has</u> <u>declared "Shōbu Ari."</u>²⁰²³

Holding the Flags & Shinpan Rotation

1. The shinpan-in shall unfurl the flags and place them on the desk, with the red flag on right and the white flag on the left. The standard distance between the handles of the red and white flags shall be 10 centimeters.

- 2. When there is a change of shinpan-in, the departing shinpan-in shall exit holding their shinpan flags²⁰²³.
- 3. Following the exchange, the incoming Shinpan-in shall unfurl their shinpan flag and place it on the shinpan's table after they take their seat.²⁰²³

Shōmen e no Rei

1. The competitor's shōmen-e-no-rei and tō-rei are considered part of their enbu. Translator's Note: (神座) Kami-za removed.²⁰²³

After the tō-rei and shōmen-e-no-rei, and the enbu is completed, the competitor shall stand in keitō shisei behind the kaishi-sen (approx. 30 cm)²⁰²³ and await the hantei decision.

When the competitors are standing (approx. 30 cm) behind the kaishi-sen, they are facing in the direction of Shōmen.²⁰²³

2. The sahō (reihō) at the beginning and end of the enbu shall be Zen Ken Ren lai sahō (reihō). 2023

Kaishi, Start

1. When starting a shiai, the competitors shall stand (approx. 30 cm)²⁰²³ behind the kaishi-sen, in keitō shisei. The shiai begins upon the Shushin's call.

Shōmen e no Rei

1. When entering or exiting, the shinpanin shall line up with the Shushin in the center, and bow to the Shōmen.

Kaishi, Start

- At the start of the first shai and the start of the final (championship, i.e., kesshōsen) shiai the Shinpan-chō shall do the following.
 - (1) In the case of a single shiai-jyō, when the first, or final, competitors are standing (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishi-sen in keitō shisei the Shinpan-chō, Shinpan-shunin, and Shinpan-in (Shushin and Fukushin)²⁰²³ shall stand up and upon the command of the Shinpan-chō will all bow to Shōmen.²⁰²³ After that²⁰²³, the shiai will then begin with the Shushin's call.

(2) In the case of a two or more shiai-jyō, when the first, or final, competitors are standing (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishi-sen in keitō shisei the Shinpan-chō, Shinpan-shunin, and Shinpan-in (Shushin and Fukushin)²⁰²³ shall stand up and upon the command of the Shinpan-chō will all bow to Shōmen.²⁰²³ After that²⁰²³, the Shinpan-chō will then signal with a whistle, or something similar, for the various Shushin to pronounce the start of their respective shiai.

Requesting a Suspension

1. When a competitor requests a shiai suspension, they must raise their hand, and speak with the Shushin, and then immediately tell the Shushin their reason for the request.

Requesting a Suspension

 When a competitor requests that a shiai be stopped, the Shushin shall immediately stop the shiai and question the reason for the request to stop.

Shiai, Shinpan Kisoku Article 24.2

2. If the shinpan-in determine that the request for suspension described in the preceding paragraph is unjustified, a gogi shall be held.

Chūshi, Suspension

1. When a Shinpan-in calls "Yame," the competitors shall immediately stop their shiai, return to the kaishi-sen (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ in taitō shisei, in order to receive pronouncements or instructions from the Shushin.

Gōgi, Conference

1. After the Shushin calls Gōgi, the competitors shall stand (approx. 30 cm)²⁰²³ behind the kaishi-sen and wait in taitō shisei in the middle of the shiai. And stand in keitō shisei after the shiai has ended.

Shinpan Guidelines

Chūshi, Suspension

- 1. A Shinpan-in shall call for suspension of the shiai in the following situations.
 - (1) Injury or accident
 - (2) To avoid a hazard
 - (3) Loss of control of the Nihon-tō
 - (4) Igi-no-Mōshitate

Translator's Note: Hansoku and Gōgi removed.²⁰²³

- 2. In the event of a call for suspension, the Shinpan-in shall do the following.
 - (1) If there is a request from a competitor to stop, the Shushin will immediately pronounce the stopp. of the shiai and simultaneously indicate with their flags.

(2) If a Fukushin pronounces a stop, the Shushin will immediately pronounce the stopp. of the shiai and simultaneously indicate with their flags.

Gōgi, Conference

- 1. The Shinpan-in shall meet for a gogi in the event of the following situations.
 - (1) Mistakes in the Shitei Waza
 - (2) Exceeding the shiai time
 - (3) Prohibited conduct
 - (4) Kantoku lodging Igi-no-Mōshitate

- 2. The Shinpan-in shall conduct a Gogi as follows.
 - (1) Signal with the flags at the same time gogi is declared and have both competitors stand (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishi-sen waiting in taitō shisei or keitō shisei.

(2) If the Fukushin calls Yame and requests a Gogi, the Shushin shall immediately stop the shiai and then signal with the flags at the same time gogi is declared. Flag Signaling Guidelines, Fig. 6 & 7,

- (3) When one competitor makes a mistake in shitei waza and the other competitor exceeds the shiai time, or when both fighters make a mistake in shitei waza or exceed the shiai time, a gogi shall be held and a decision shall be made in accordance with Article 11.1 of the Regulations.²⁰²³
- (4) During the shiai, no points will be deducted if a competitor steps on the kaishi-sen or is located on either side of or in front of the kaishi-sen.²⁰²³

(5) If, during a shiai, one of the competitor's feet is completely out of the field, i.e., jyōgai, or if they are suspected of doing so, a gōgi will be held to confirm the situation. 2023

Saikai, Resumption

1. When restarting a shiai after it has been stopped, the shiai shall be resumed upon the declaration of the Shushin while the the competitors wait standing (approx. 30 cm)²⁰²³ behind the kaishisen.

Igi-no-Mōshitate, Formal Objection

 In the event of a Kantoku lodging an Igino-Mōshitate, the competitors shall stand by in the same manner as in the case of a "Gōgi."

Saikai, Resumption

 When a shiai is resumed after it has been stopped, the Shushin shall follow the procedures for starting the shiai. Flag Signaling Guidelines, Fig 3., p. 13

Igi-no-Mōshitate, Formal Objection

- 1. In the event of Igi-no-Mōshitate, the Shinpan-in shall do the following.
 - (1) The Shinpan-in shall immediately stop the shiai.
 - Flag Signaling Guidelines, Fig. 6, p. 14
 - (2) The Shinpan-shunin or the Shinpan-chō will have the Shinpan-in review the details of the gōgi among themselves.
 - (3) The Shinpan-shunin or the Shinpan-chō will inform the Kantoku of the results.
 - (4) The Shushin shall restart the shiai. Flag Signaling Guidelines, Fig. 3, p. 13

Shōhai no Kettei, Deciding Victory & Defeat

1. After their enbu is finished, and they have performed torei and shomen-eno-rei, the competors shall stand (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishisen in keitō shisei to await the winning and losing decision.

Shiai Funō, Incapacitated for Shiai

1. When declaring a winner of the shiai due to an incapacitation, the fighter shall stand (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishi-sen in keitō shisei for the Shushin's pronouncement.

Fusen-gachi, Victory by Forfeit or Bye

1. When a competitor is declared the winner due to forfeit, they shall stand (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishisen in keitō shisei, the same as if they had an opponent. After receiving the Shushin's declaration, they shall return to their original position.²⁰²³

Shūryō, End

1. When a shiai ends, the competitors shall stand (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishi-sen in keitō shisei. After the Shushin has declared the result, they shall exit the shiai-jyō, sit in seiza and perform a mutual bow, ie., sogo-no-rei.

Shōhai no Kettei, Deciding Victory & Defeat

1. When deciding the winner, the Shinpanin shall indicate with their flag on the side judged to be the winner in conjunction with the Shushin calling "Hantei."

Flag Signaling Guidelines, Fig. 4, p. 13 In this case, calling a hikiwake or abstain from the decision is not allowed.

Shiai Funō, Incapacitated for Shiai

1. When declaring a winner of the shiai due to an incapacitation, the Shushin shall indicate with their flag at the same time they declare the winning side. Flag Signaling Guidelines, Fig. 5, p. 14

Fusen-gachi, Victory by Forfeit or Bye

1. The Shushin will indicate with their flag at the same time as they declare the winning side.

Shūryō, End

1. When the enbu is over and the competitors are standing (approx. 30 cm) behind²⁰²³ the kaishi-sen in keitō shisei, the Shinpan-in shall indicate with their flag at the same time that the Shushin makes their pronouncement.

2. When a shiai has finished, the Shinpanin shall remain seated. 2023 While seated and prior to leaving the court, i.e., taijyō, they shall roll up both flags, with white on the inside and red on the outside. Then the Shinpan-in shall exit holding the shinpan flags in their right hand, After their exit 2023 they shall line up with the Shushin in the center 2023 and perform shōmen-e-no-rei, and then a mutual sōgo-no-rei. 2023

Sono Hoka no Yōryō, Other Guidelines

- 1. The competitor's uniform shall be clean and free of rips and tears.
- 2. The competitor uniform shall be a navy blue, black or white kendō-gi or iaidō gi with tubular sleeves, and hakama. Additonally, both the upper gi, i.e., uwagi and hakama must be the same color.²⁰²³
- 3. The use of footwear, i.e., tabi, by competitors is permitted, but only when medically necessary for participation in the shiai. 2023

Sono Hoka no Yōryō, Other Guidelines

- 1. Before the start of the shiai, the Shinpan-in shall verify that the competitors have an appropriate uniform (kendo or iaido gi, hakama, and nafuda).
- 2. The Shinpan-in will make sure that an appropriate sword is used.
- 3. The Shinpan-in will strictly discipline the competitors if they engage in inappropriate words or deeds while in the players' area or elsewhere after their shiai is over.

- 4. The Nihon-tō mekugi and other parts should be carefully checked to ensure safety.
- 5. The Shitei Waza will be announced by the Shinpan-chō prior to the start of the first round on the day of the taikai. If the Shitei Waza is announced by the Shinpan-chō after the second round, the competitors should stand-by at the waiting line, i.e., taiki-sen, and enter after the announcement.²⁰²³
- 6. The competitors shall not enter the shiai-jyō until the Shinpan-in have been replaced and are in position.
- 7. When the outgoing competitor finishes their shiai and leaves the area from (approx. 30 cm) behind the kaishi-sen, the incoming competitor shall enter the shiai-jyō and pass the outgoing competitor outside the shiai-jyō while staying on the left during the exchange. 2023

- Kantoku and competitors may not bring a timer into the players' seating area, give signals, or cheer for the competitors.
- 9. When competitors line up for the opening and closing ceremonies, they shall be in a keitō shisei. 2023

- 4. If a Shinpan-in and athlete are from the same prefecture, it is recommended that the Shinpan-in be replaced with another Shinpan-in. 2023
- 5. All officials shall coordinate in advance with the Shinpan-shushin or Shinpan-chō to ensure the smooth execution of their duties.
- 6. The notice board manager shall inspect and check the Shinpan flags.

- Dotted lines indicate Shinpan-in rotation





Fig. 2, Competitor Exchange Guidelines 2023

Fig. 1, Kihon Shisei

- Unfurl the flags and place them on the desk, with the red flag on right and the white flag on the left.
- The Shinpan-in sits in a chair.




Fig. 2, Announcing the start of the first and final shiai

- The Shinpan-in shall unfurl the flags and place them on the desk, with the red flag on right and the white flag on the left.
- o The Shushin and both Fukushin shall stand.






Fig. 3, When the Shushin Starts, Restarts, or declares "Hantei"



Shushin

- The Shinpan-in shall unfurl the flags and place them on the desk, with the red flag on right and the white flag on the left.
 - The Shushin shall stand, and the Fukushin remain seated in their chairs.

- The Shushin shall stand and raises their flag diagonally upward.
 - The Fukushin shall remain seated in their chairs and raise their flags diagonally upward.

- The Shushin shall stand and raises their flag diagonally upward.
- The Fukushin shall remain seated in their chairs.



Fig. 6, During Suspension



 The Shinpan-in shall stand and raises both flags straight up.

Fig. 7, During Gōgi



 The Shinpan-in shall stand holding both flags in their right hand and raise them straight up.

Posting Guidelines

- 1. The results of the shiai shall be accurately displayed on the scoreboard so that the outcome can be determined following the the Shushin's call and the display of the Shinpan-in flags.
- 2. During the shiai, post the names of the Shinpan-in and Players (Team) name on the scoreboard, as shown in Figure 1.
